2019 - Lyceum Village Summer Camp Electives Descriptions

ACADEMICS:

1. **Genius Club** [AM & PM flexible hours]

Keep up with math and academics during the summer during these proctored independent study blocks. You can bring your own summer work, or we can provide you with one that is aligned with state reading and math standards, along with a recommended summer reading list. Do a little - or a lot - all summer long, and retain skills from your previous grade or get ahead of the game!

Instructor: Lyceum Village Genius Club staff / grades 1-5: materials fee of \$10 for summer workbook, or provide your own.

2. #FUN with STEM (All/3:30-5:30)

Have #FUN all summer long with awesome hands-on projects! This camp session encourages kids to tap into the imaginative and creative facets of their STEM knowledge. Each week will feature a new STEM-focused project: from conceptualizing and developing a superhero, to designing and building a rocket-ship using a 3D printer. Instructor: Lyceum Village Genius Club/E1 staff, \$10 materials fee

3. **Beginner Robotics: #FUN with Dash and Dot** [wks 1,2,5,6,9/11:00-12:30]

Beginner: #FUN with Dash and Dot! Bring coding and STEAM to life with smart robots. Develop and apply coding skills through hands-on experiences. Engage spatial awareness and solve multi-step problems with computer science concepts. Instructor: Lyceum Village Genius Club/E1 staff

4. Advanced Robotics [wks 3,4,7,8,10/11:00-12:30]

Design. Build. Drive. Explore advanced robotics by building and Arduino-compatible robots. Students will build and program a multi-functional robot with obstacle avoidance line tracking and IR control.

5. Harry Potter Adventures / English Language Arts [wks 1,3,5/10:30-12:30]

Meet us at Platform 9¾ as we fly into the world of Harry Potter for a week of magic and fun. From potions class to Quidditch practice, as we read about life in the wizarding world, campers will participate in challenges and activities to help them pass their classes and graduate from Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry. (3rd – 6th graders)

6. Variations on a Magical Tale / English Language Arts [wks 1,3,5/8:30-10:30]

Were you aware that every culture has a Cinderella story! Join us to explore the traditional Cinderella that we all know and love, and hear other Cinderella stories, and even create your own Cinderella story that you will write, illustrate, and take home. (1st – 3rd graders)

7. English Language Arts: Multimedia storytelling [wks 7/8:30-10:30]

Students in this course will explore new, powerful modes of storytelling, working with the instructors to develop their own, original ideas for a podcast series. Lessons will guide students through the creative processes of podcasting, introducing students to the formal conventions of the medium. Students who have a strong interest in multimedia storytelling are strongly encouraged to join in, but students who are just looking to hone their general writing skills are also welcome. (ages 8-13)

8. English Language Arts: Introduction to Creative Writing [wks 2,8/8:30-10:30]

This course is perfect for young students who are interested in creative writing or who are just looking to sharpen their writing in a fun, imaginative environment. Students will learn the very basics of creative writing: structuring a narrative, developing characters, and using descriptive words to add depth and meaning to their writing. Students will write and illustrate their own picture book over the course of a week. (ages 6-8)

9. English Language Arts: Fiction Writing for Young Authors [wk 9/8:30-10:30]

This creative writing program is designed to give students a broad overview of short fiction writing, focusing on the basics: creating outlines, using transitional devices, and crafting coherent paragraphs. Over the span of a week, students will develop and write an original short story. Students at all levels are welcome. (ages 8-10)

10. English Language Arts: The Short Story [wks 4,10/8:30-10:30]

This course is designed for middle school students who have a passion for writing. Students will take part in close readings, guided discussions, and peer feedback sessions. The objective of this class is to not just help students develop their own creative voices, but to also connect them to a community of young writers. Students who take this course will complete an original work of short fiction. (ages 10-12)

11. Engineering Internship [all/flexible hours]

Spend eight weeks this summer working with an industry expert in the field of Biomedical Engineering. Andrew Larson is an expert in electrical, software, and medical engineering and will be working with a team of young interns interested in the field. He, with select interns will build an original piece of equipment designed for future commercial use by the public. Intern's will be named on the patent applied for by Lyceum Village.

12. **French Immersion** [wks 1,2,3/9-12p, 1-4p]

This class is perfect French-speaking students wanting to learn and practice a little more French during the summer. Sign up for any, or all of our 4-weeks of French classes this summer.

13. Beginning Japanese, part 1 and part 2 [All/1:30-3:30]

Learn Japanese from the start! No experience necessary. This class is designed for beginners with each class designed to stand alone, or build from one session to the next. In **Part 1**, campers will learn how to count, introduce themselves, and respond to basic questions, such as their names and phone numbers. New hiragana and katagana writing characters will be introduced weekly, and learn simple kanji as well! **Part 2**, second hour, campers will participate in a Japanese immersion activity or craft - *including making Hello Kitty cupcakes and onigiri*. (Grades 3 and up)

16. **SAT/ACT/PSAT Prep** [wks 2-7/must register for all 6-week of morning camp]

Six consecutive weeks of intensive test preparation including 90-mins of lecture, lessons, or practice tests, followed by a break consisting of a camp elective of your choice, then an additional 90-minues of PSAT class, homework, and tutoring for a total of 3-hours per day of PSAT training! Outcomes from this local program over the past 8-years have proven to be extremely successful with students obtaining top scores on their SAT exams. Students from Beckman and University High Schools completing the course received rare perfect scores, with others scoring in the high 1400-1500's after taking this course. Whatever your SAT goals are, serious students enrolling in this program will surely improve test scores over the summer! 1. Basketball [All/8:30-3:30 flexible hours]

MUSIC:

1. The Art of Practice / Music Practice [AM & PM flexible hours]
